Pickleball courts are getting busier with our lake residents partaking in court times. There is also a softball field, playground equipment for the younger generation and walking trails.

We had another controversial building project on our lake this year. The County erroneously provided a setback measurement for a new home build allowing it to be 86 feet from the lake vs the required 100' foot required. Although we protested the Alternative Variance request at the Crow Wing Planning Commission Board of Adjustment meeting in April, the planning commission board unanimously approved the alternative variance for the builder, B-Dirt, to proceed with completing their house. HLPOA Board Members agreed that our best approach would be to work with the builder to improve lake protection on that lot instead of appealing this decision by hiring an attorney. We worked with the builder (B-Dirt) and finalized an agreement to waive our right to appeal the variance in exchange for B Dirt's commitment to work with Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation to develop a strategy for lake protection on this property. They agreed to develop and execute a plan to improve runoff protection with landscaping and plants to improve filtration. We look forward to seeing the results of their commitment.

Mark your calendars now to plan to attend our Annual HLPOA Meeting on August 3rd. The Board will provide updates and we will also have lake items available for sale. Watch for updates. Social time will begin at 8:00 a.m. with the meeting at 8:30 a.m. Plan to come and see what's happening on Horseshoe.



AIS

Aquatic Invasive Species Inspectors have started working at the public landing, but their hours are limited. If you are interested in being trained to volunteer as an AIS inspector at the public access, training will take place in June. Please contact Judy Deis ASAP at mdeis@comcast.net for more information. Help keep our lake free from

invasive species by decontaminating your boat or jet ski if it's been on another lake. Also encourage guests or renter to do the same.

The Crow Wing County AIS decontamination stations are also open to boaters free of charge. The County's permanent decontamination unit at the Crosslake Joint Highway Maintenance Facility at 13870 Whipple Drive is fully staffed from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., Friday through Sunday. Two mobile units are located at different public accesses throughout the county. They will be open 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday through Sunday. The loons are back! There have been reports of pairs swimming in both basins. The nesting platform built by Eagle Scout Thomas Hansen has been put in the bay in the East Basin. Please be respectful of the loons' space!

There is a bobcat roaming the east bay area so watch your pets!

There have been many bear sightings as well. We have had bears getting into trash on the west basin. Properly disposing of garbage before leaving the cabin and putting a little bleach on top of the bags in the garbage receptacle will keep the bears away.

Some area recycling centers have closed due to misuse, but there is still a local option: Ideal Corners Transfer station is located at <u>33503 W Island Lake Dr,</u> <u>Pequot Lakes, Mn</u>

56472. This recycling center is monitored and is clean and organized for regular recycling as well as appliances, paint, etc. A yearly permit fee of \$15 is required to use the facility plus there is an additional charge for each item. But the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species has a simple solution - if everyone thoroughly Cleaned, Drained and Dried their boats and water related equipment after each use, and then inspected it prior to each use in a new water body. AIS would not spread. This is why education is the cornerstone of all efforts to protect our lakes and rivers from aquatic invasive species. Grilled Corn with Lime Butter

Finely grated zest of one lime 1/8 teaspoon hot pepper sauce 1/8 teaspoon tequila (optional)

Kosher salt and freshly grated pepper

Mix ingredients with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup (4 oz.) of unsalted butter at room temperature. Transfer to an airtight container and refrigerate until hardened before using. It will keep for one week in the refrigerator or one month in the freezer. You will have enough for 8 ears of grilled corn.

Shuck the corn and remove silk. Prepare a charcoal or gas grill for direct grilling over medium heat. Brush grill grates with oil. Place corn on the grill directly over the fire and cook, turning every couple of minutes, all the way around each ear. The kernels should become bright yellow and pick up some charring from the grill. You don't want blackened corn, just an accent of caramelization from the fire. Usually corn needs no more than 5 minutes on the grill, 8 minutes at the most.


